Where to Start

There are four easy ways to find content on Teaching Physician.org:

1. Pick One of 12 Sections as a Starting Point

TeachingPhysician.org is divided into 12 sections built around topics. Begin at the <u>Content landing page</u> to see a section overview.

2. Use the Topic Index

If you're looking for something specific, go to the <u>Topic Index</u> for a comprehensive list of every content page on TeachingPhysician.org.

3. Follow a Learning Path

<u>Learning paths</u> guide you through content that has been curated to meet specific learning objectives.

4. Read the Focus of the Month Archive

Every month, Teaching Physician.org sends out an email highlighting content from the website. The <u>Focus of the Month</u> archive gathers these emails into one place, providing you with easy access to specific subjects and related pages.
